



Any medication brought to school by a student needs to be clearly labelled with:

the dosage required the time the medication needs to be administered.

Parents/carers need to ensure that the medication a student has at school is within its expiry date. If school staff become aware that the medication a student has at school has expired, they will contact parents/carers who will need to arrange for medication within the expiry date to be provided.

If a student needs to take medication at school or a school activity, the school nurse as principal nominee will ensure that:

1. Medication is administered to the student in accordance with the Medication Authority Form so that:

the student receives their correct medication in the proper dose via the correct method (for example, inhaled or orally)



The nurse and wellbeing team may decide, in consultation with parents/carers and/or on the advice eating medical/health practitioner:

to allow the student to carry their own medication with them, preferably in the original packaging if:

- o the medication does not have special storage requirements, such as refrigeration
- o doing so does not create potentially unsafe access to the medication by other students.
